This is a pretty long letter but I guess you won't mind. I wish I could make my letters more interesting, but you see nothing exciting happens here, we're so far from bombardments and raids and all the highly colored part of it. Anne and Louise could tell you much more interesting stories I know - if they could - for they're at a critical spot. Over here I'm just between and though I love the work better every day it isn't exciting. The boys have left home and aren't yet at the front. It's just the rather dull in between here. Just where the "Y" is most needed I believe, but it doesn't make good writing. However, I know you're interested.
